Dear Online Student:

Welcome to the online class program of Elgin Community College. We are happy you have registered for an online class, and hope the online experience proves to be a valuable one for you. I have some important details to share with you regarding your class.

Desire2Learn is the course management system used by ECC faculty to manage online classes. A user name and password is needed to access D2L. To obtain your user name and password carefully read the instructions outlined below:

Applies to Both Returning and New Students:

User Name:

Your user name is your Access ECC User ID:
e_____ (small letter "e" followed by seven digit ECC ID number)

If you do not know your ECC ID, go to www.elgin.edu, click on the "access ECC" icon, and then "click here to get your user ID".

Password:

If you are a returning student to D2L, your password will remain the same. If you are a new student to D2L, your temporary password is your birth date: mmddyy. Example: January 1, 1984 = 010184. You will be prompted to change this information upon entering the system for the first time.

Directions on how to access your class are explained below.

To access your class from the ECC Online page (www.elgin.edu/online) click on the link to "D2L" and then click on Desire2Learn Login. Enter your User Name and Password. Remember, you will not have access to your class until the start date of classes. Once you can access your class, carefully read any announcements, class syllabus, and other pertinent information your instructor has provided. In some cases there are immediate due dates so be sure to pay special attention to this material. Another reminder: Most of the online classes are not self-paced - students progress through the class as a group, so be prepared to work with your fellow class members. Something else you should know – some of our online classes require proctored exams. If you live outside of the district arrangements can be made (in most instances) for you to test at a location near your residence. Either call me or your instructor for further information regarding this.
