



The "look and feel" of the website includes both its appearance and the user interface.






Create a folder named facultyWebsite in the MyFiles folder on your PAD.

We're going to use NVU on your Portable Application Device.




Double-Click on PStart.exe



Double-Click on PortableNVU






Chose a color scheme


In the Format menu, chose Page colors and Background.

Select use custom colors.


Double-click a color to edit.






Save your site before you publish


