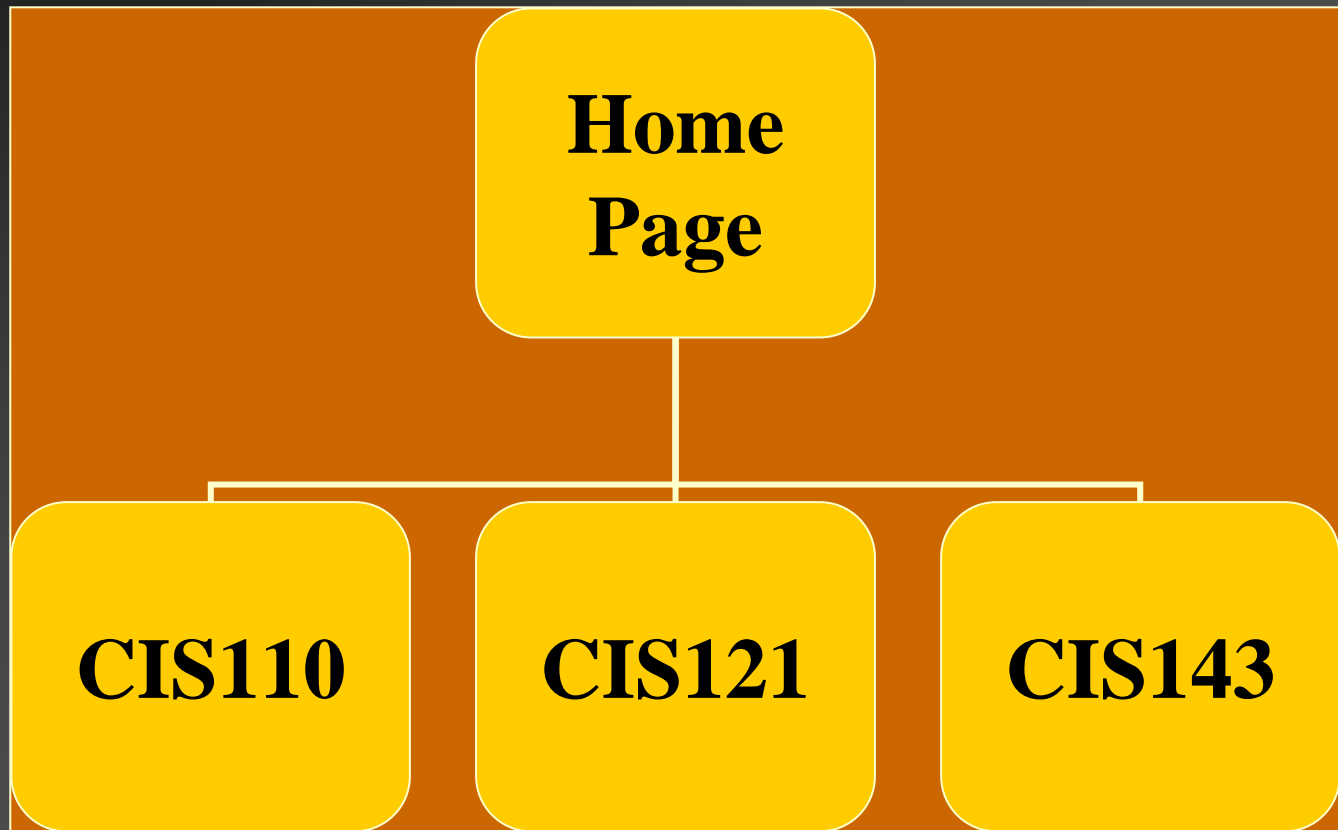

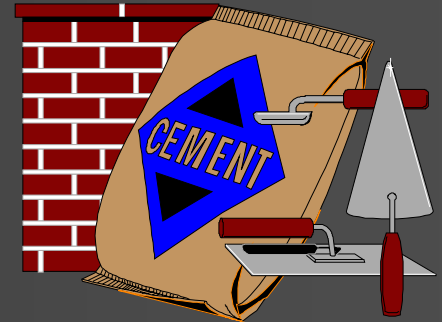

The “look and feel” of the website includes both its appearance and the user interface.

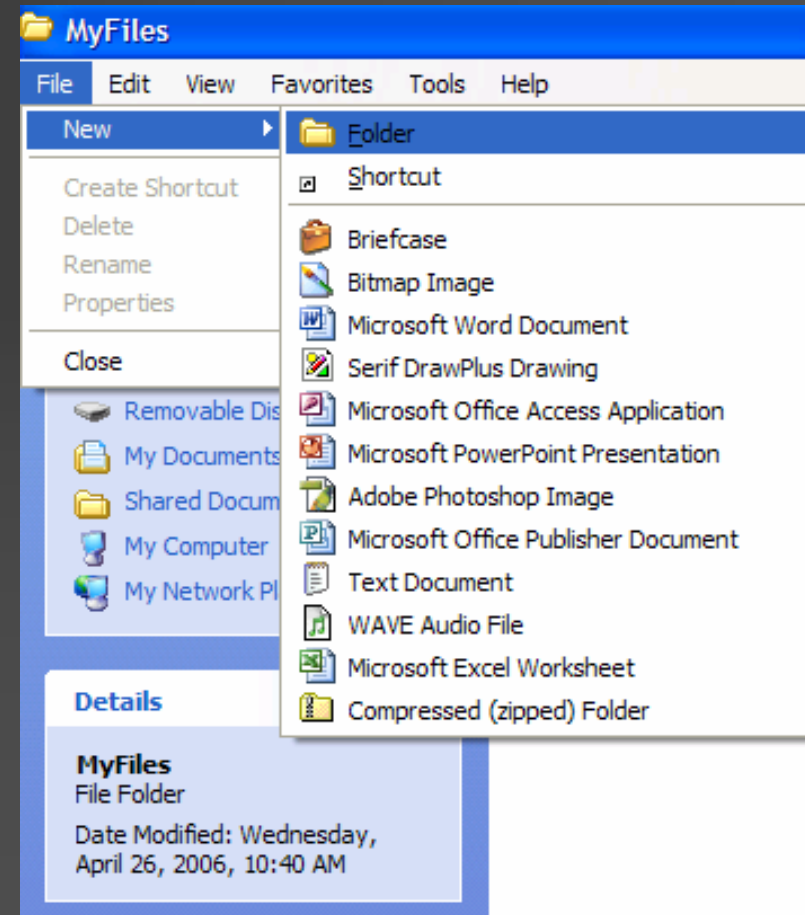

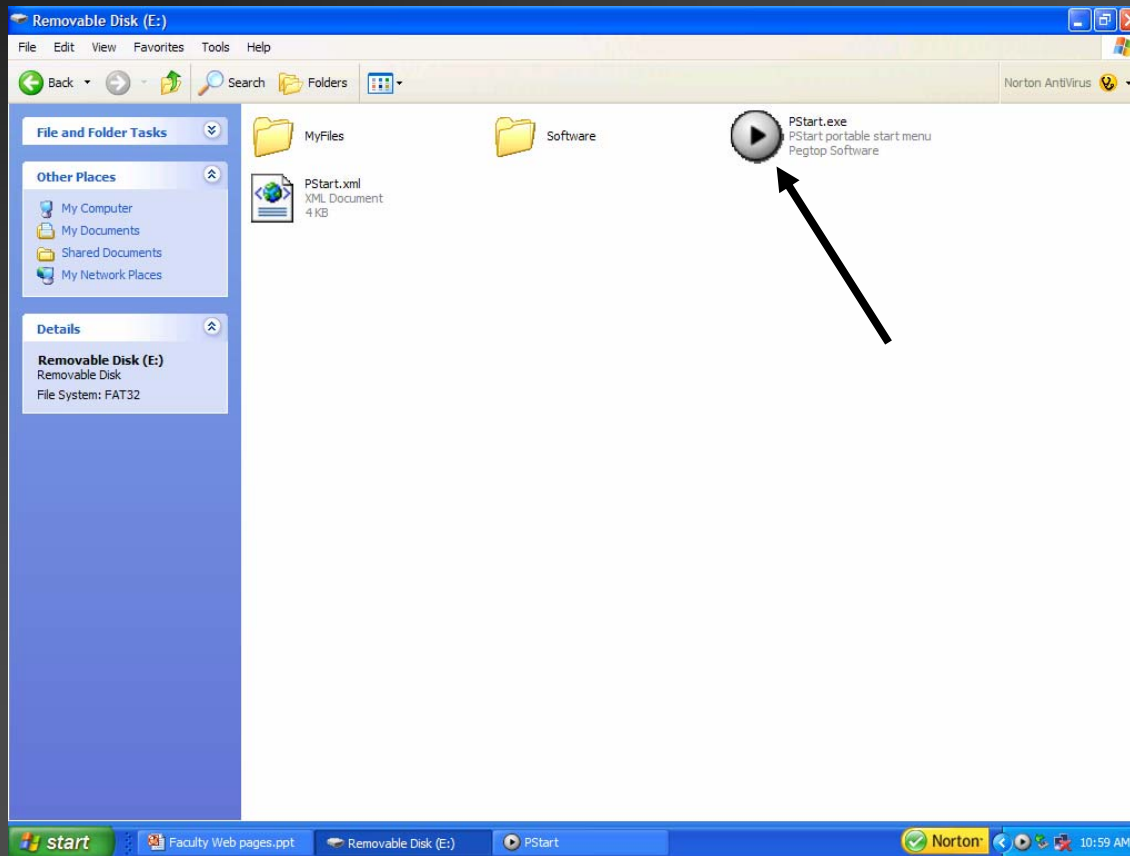


Create a folder named facultyWebsite in the MyFiles folder on your PAD.

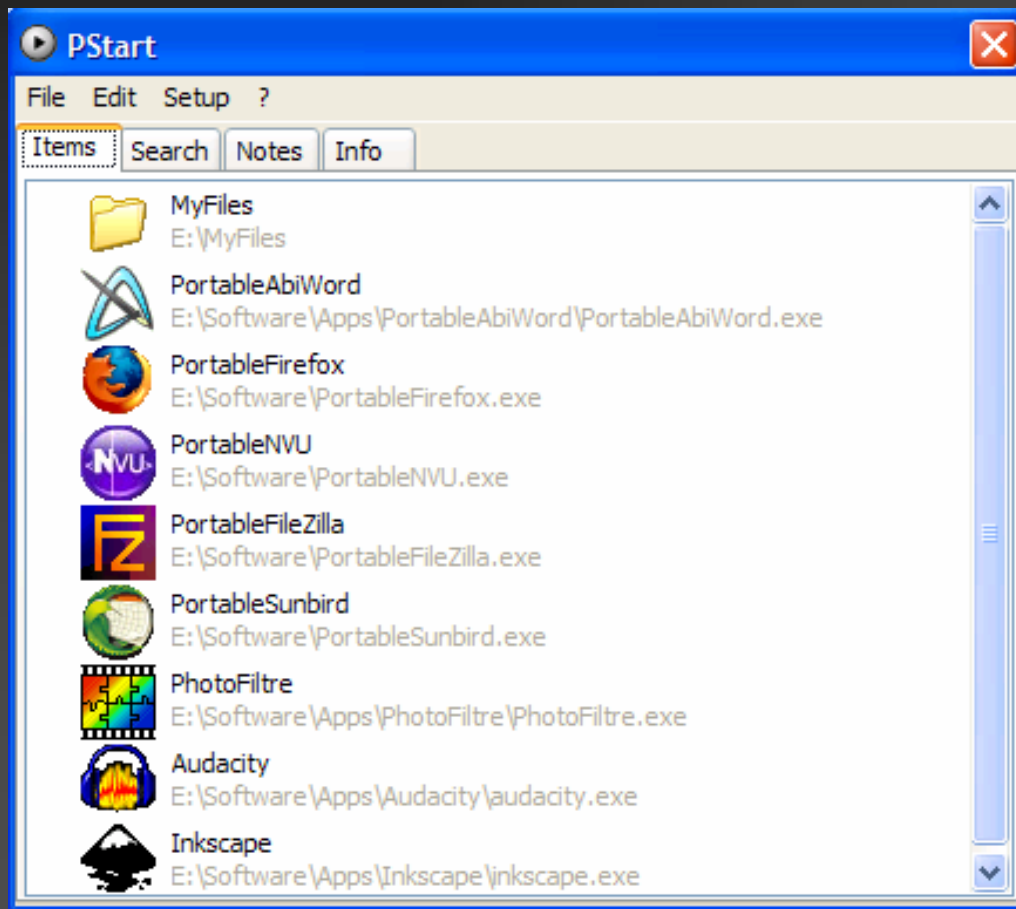
We're going to use NVU on your Portable Application Device.

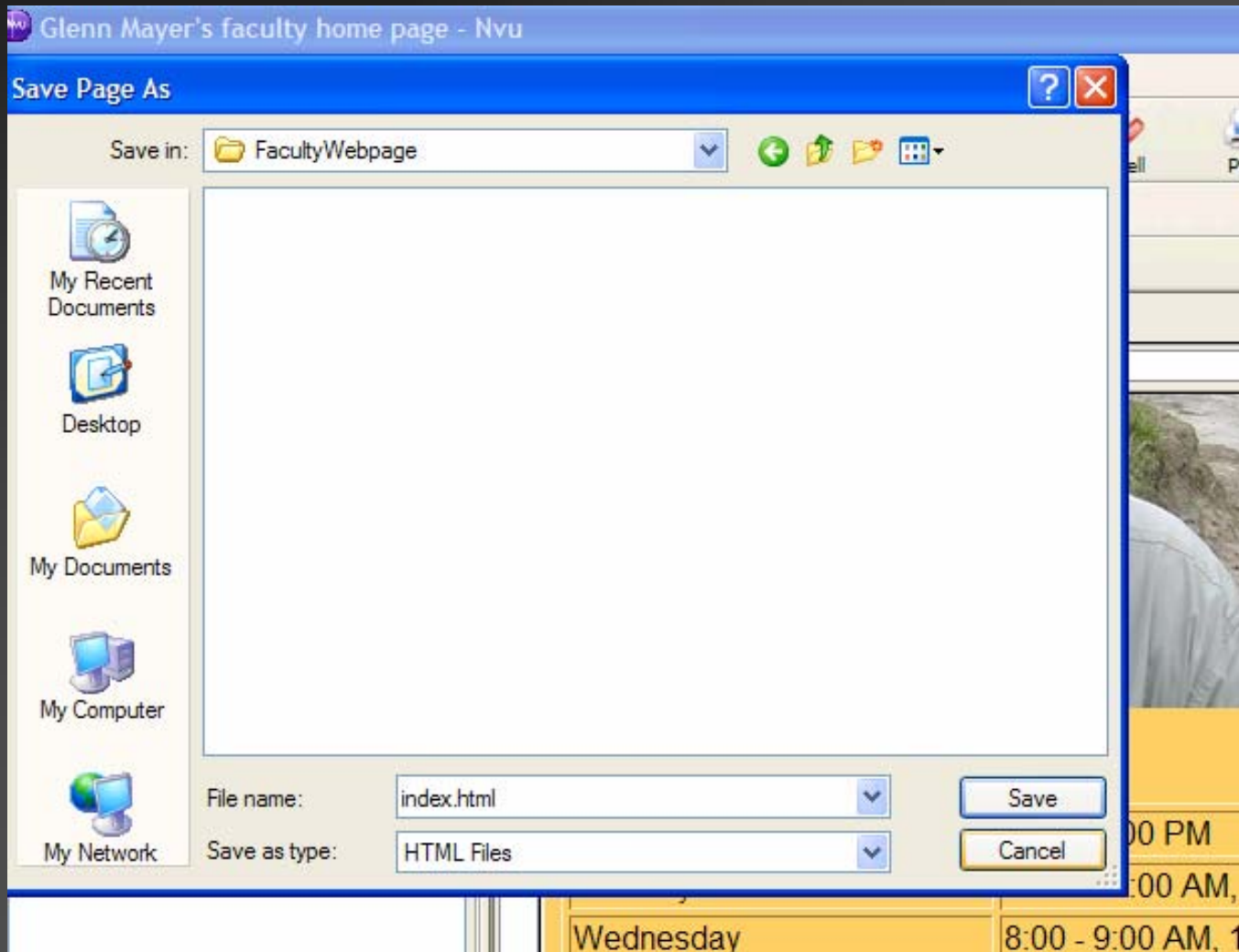


Save your site before you publish

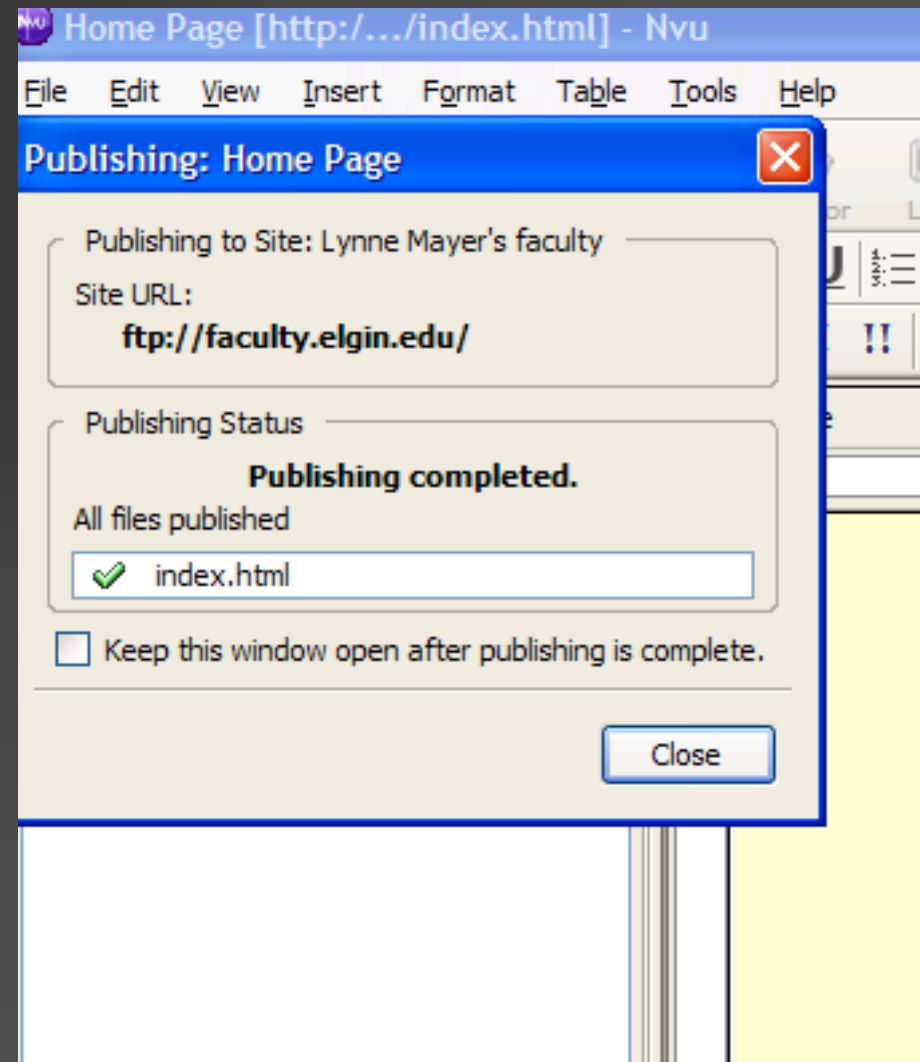
